

## **Franke and adval tech plan closer cooperation**

**Aarburg/Niederwangen, May 31, 2002. - Franke Holding Ltd., Aarburg, and adval tech Holding Ltd., Niederwangen, have signed a letter of intent to enter into closer cooperation. Specifically, their activities in the field of steering systems for the automotive industry are to be merged into a joint company by mid-2003.**

Franke Holding Ltd. has already been linked with the adval tech Group for some years through a holding of 10% in its share capital. With the letter of intent signed a few days ago, Franke and adval tech aim to exploit potential synergies in the field of stamping and forming. The goal of the two parties is to sign a cooperation agreement by the end of this year. If this materializes, the activities of Franke and adval tech in the field of steering systems for the automotive industry will be merged. The intention is to establish a joint company for the development and production of automotive and industrial components by mid-2003. This would include the existing plants operated by adval tech subsidiary Styner+Bienz FormTech Ltd. in Uetendorf (Switzerland) and São José dos Pinhais (Brazil) as well as the plant operated by Franke subsidiary Lanz Industrietechnik Ltd. in Wolfwil (Switzerland).
